And isn't it a beauty? How many of you out there would like to order arm patches for your jacket or show-coat? Let me know as soon as possible so that when arrangements are made to have these manufactured we will know how many to order. What would you think of giving these as club awards for shows where more than one club member is competing in place of cash or rosettes? Again, let me know your wishes as we aim to please - it's your club.

The artist is Rusty Hart, a friend of Jeanne Trent of Michigan who is one of our two fine candidates for secretary-treasurer of the club. Jeanne informs me that the design was done freehand on her kitchen table by kerosene lamp, near a wood fire, during a snowstorm in northern Michigan last winter. Rusty wins the prize offered - a two year membership to the club, and also a a free armpatch as soon as they are available. Though not formerly an Ameraucana breeder, word is that Rusty is now working on brown-red Ameraucana large fowl, using stock secured from Jeanne. These are already in the A.P.A. standard, allthough I don't know of any others that currently exist. So Good Luck on the project, Rusty, and congratulations from all of us on the terrific logo. THE SHOWS

According to our bylaws, one District Meet is to be placed annually by each District Director within his or her club district. Therefore, as soon as election results are announced, it is requested the newly elected directors make arrangements with the newly elected secretary to fulfill this annual obligation. I cannot stress adequately the necessity for coordination between directors and the club secretary in placing any and all meets. We also are to hold one national meet each year, to be rotated among the various districts. It is suggested that anyone interested in holding the national meet at one of the shows you are attending should get in touch immediately with the secretary or your director so that arrangements can be made as soon as possible. Please keep in mind that these major show meets should be placed at shows where as many of our members as possible can attend.

Any member can request one State meet for any state once per year. Also, special meets can be requested when the State meet precludes another official meet within a particular state in a given year. If all this seems confusing, just call or write your secretary or director.

The 1985 Ohio State Meet was held in conjunction with the Ohio National at Columbus, Ohio last November 9th & 10th. As we have not re-ordered club rosettes pending the upcoming election, the club provided \$5.00 for best and \$3.00 for reserve Ameraucana bantams. Other awards were provided by members. The best (BB) was won by Jeanne Trent on a wheaten pullet. Reserve (RB) was won by a nonmember, therefore no club prize was awarded. Curtis Oakes judged.

The 1986 Michigan State meet was held at the Bay City show last January 18th & 19th, 1986, with Henry Mager placing the awards. Best again went the way of Jeanne Trent on a wheaten hen. Reserve was awarded to member Lois Bouck on a blue-wheaten. The same cash awards were awarded as for the Ohio State meet.

A special meet was awarded the South Iowa Poultry Ass'n show held June 7th & 8th, 1986, at Clarinda Iowa. We have not yet received the results, but hope that Bernard Conkling and Chris & Steve Simpson had a great time. Be sure to send in those results, fellas, or have the show secretary mail them in. Thanks!

Though no meet is involved, Jim Tuckwood has once again put up a trophy for best Ameraucana bantam at the Dairyland Classic show to be held at Richland Center, Wisconsin the last weekend of June, 1986. Hope to see Jim and Bernard Kellogg there, also Carroll Johnson of Minnesota. Dave Horman, who is handling our club finances on an interim basis until we elect a new secretary-treasurer, will not be there. Dave is traveling to Germany this month with his wife, Bonnie, to visit their two sons stationed in the army over there. Have a safe trip, Dave.

The last show I attended was the Wisconsin State Poultry Breeders show held at the Wisconsin state fairgrounds October 4th & 5th, 1985. The host poultry club put up a nice trophy for BB, which I was fortunate enough to win on a white hen. Dave Horman had reserve on a white pullet.

One final note on showing Ameraucanas. We have had reports of judges placing yellow and willow shanked birds above those with slate colored shanks which the written standard requires. Do not be afraid to confront judges about these honest mistakes, because I don't know of any judge who knows the standard by heart. To err is human, and we will have these mistakes as long as we have human judges.
